




U10 teams v The Beacon Friday 21st June

St John's lost the toss and MTS elected to field first. Colgate and Kruger opened with some assertive batting. Colgate started with a quintuple of dots followed by a single to put himself back on strike after the over. Colgate swung ambitiously at the ball but failed to make contact and it went straight past to dismiss him for 1. Kruger then started his tirade after this with 3 4's and a couple of singles in partnership with Horrocks coming in to support. Kruger hit a lofted drive which was caught by an athletic catch from Mr Greenaway from MTS to put Kruger out for 14 which saw Lambden enter the arena. Together Horrocks and Lambden scored 5 and 9 respectively before Gregory and Wang achieved a partnership of 50 on Wang's debut. Batting first we were soon in trouble losing Alex in the first over. We continued to struggle against some quick, accurate and sometimes hostile fast bowling on a difficult pitch, and had only reached 39-3 by the end of the twelfth over with only Shane, who played the shot of the day but was dismissed shortly afterwards, looking at all comfortable. MTS held their catches, fielded aggressively in support of their bowlers and looked purposeful as a team whilst some of our players seemed intimidated by the situation. Eventually, Shivam, who had hung on gamely, profited from one loose over and began to score more quickly, hitting several boundaries before holing out for 29. 
