






Meeting some Rainforest animals in Year 1



Trian (5K) and Middlesex Tennis had a very successful weekend in Sunderland and are the newly crowned National County Boys U10 champions. This was an exceptional achievement as unseeded Middlesex had to overcome the favourite and number 1 seeds Hertfordshire in their first match. Middlesex then beat the 3rd seeds Yorkshire and subsequently won all of their ties in the group going in to the final unbeaten. The final against Kent was fantastic. Kent were up 2-1 in the singles rubbers meaning Middlesex (Trian and his partner) had to win the remaining doubles rubber to get to 2-2 and then win championship tie break which they did emphatically. Middlesex last won this cup 10 years ago. There were 44 counties in the draw this year. This was a wonderful and unforgettable experience for Trian. He played singles and doubles against the best players in Great Britain and is now a National champion.




Year 8 visit to two iconic concert halls


