#### Alumni news

Recently we have been in touch with Ian Vicary, who attended St John's with his brothers Christopher and Michael in the 1950s. When the brothers were at St John's, the School was based in a large house in Paines Lane in Pinner. Ian remembers playing with Dinky Toys in breaks, attending woodwork classes in the attic workshop, the hatch system which was erected every day to connect the kitchen and the dining room at meal times and the old buses, one with stairs outside at the back that took the boys to the West Harrow Swimming Pool. He recalls that hot Bovril and a jam doughnut was the treat for after swimming – the water was probably very cold. Mr Stevie Stephens taught him to swim using a hoop on the end of a rope to pull him along.

Ian sent us this lovely photo of himself and Christopher in their St John's uniforms, with purple caps, taken in Trafalgar Square in 1949/1950. On the 1953 school photo, Ian is in the bottom right corner and his brother Christopher is standing at the top far left.

Christopher went on to Merchant Taylors' and then into the Merchant Navy and Ian and Michael went to Framlington College and then worked in accountancy and banking respectively.












# Merchant Taylors' Photography Competition We have heard from the Merchant Taylors' Company that seven of our photographs on the theme of power have been shortlisted
