The planets are aligning

If you look south after sunset you will see the brilliant planet Venus shining brightly and as you turn to the east you should see the much dimmer Saturn, which will show it rings in a small telescope, and further round you will see the bright planet Jupiter, the biggest planet in our solar system. In the top photo, taken last Friday with my phone you can see the moon in the top left and if you follow the line down, you can see Jupiter, Saturn and then Venus. I took the shot of the crescent moon with a mobile phone using an 8" telescope. Maybe you could try take your own pictures of the heavens over the holidays.


Year 6 Home Front Posters
