Practical Maths in Year 3

The boys worked really well together and took it in turns to do the measuring or recording the distances using a clipboard and pencil! Everyone enjoyed the practical lesson and they now have a better understanding of distance.

All the boys should be commended on their efforts in this first and always tough tournament.


























Congratulations to our artists of the week. **Henry, Jamie and Zreh.**

- 6. Some boys in **Art Club** have been experimenting with paint and varnish. **Anek and Darwin** are pictured with theirs.








