Climate change - the impact



This week to support St John's 'Walk to School Thursdays' the Eco Council presented an assembly on climate change. The assembly looked at the causes of the climate crisis and how we can change things in our daily lives to help prevent it. The boys explained that walking to school and 'switching-off' reduces our carbon footprint. We also looked at the environmental impact of eating meat and how this is causing deforestation. It was explained that the loss of these forest habitats coupled with climate change is causing over 200 species a day to become extinct. Part of the assembly touched on the work by environmental campaigners like Greta Thunberg to make government take action on the climate crisis. 
1st, 2nd & 3rd teams v St John's Beaumont




St John's Beaumont 49 all out, St John's 49
