The Power of Persuasion



This term, students in Year 7 have been studying spoken language. They have been analysing how speech writers use language to make their speeches powerful. For the Persuasive Writing Competition, their assignment was to write a speech about something they care about. They were assessed on how successfully they used persuasive language in its spoken form. All Year 7 students created a thesis and spoke about it in English lessons. The standards of all of the assignments were exceptional and teachers had a difficult decision to make about the winning speeches. The six finalists were Amos, Ansh and Benyamin from 7J and Albert, Yash and Aryan from 7H. Amos has written about his experience of this task.

"Before writing our persuasive speeches we studied some very famous speeches in history including Winston Churchill's, Malala Yousafzai's and Martin Luther King's. Then we were given homework to look at different persuasive and paralinguistic devices in speeches and formulate our thesis for our persuasive speech, which we would present to our class. The following week we started writing our speeches. On the 26th November we listened to everyone's speeches. There was a variety of topics and it was exciting to listen to all of them.

On Tuesday 1st December Ansh, Benyamin and I were invited to Mr Robinson's office to read our speeches in front of him and Mr Russo. I was extremely nervous but the other boys reassured me. I read my speech with confidence and I was very clear. I was very grateful that I got the opportunity to read my speech in front of the Headmaster and congratulations to all the boys in Year 7. Overall, I learnt a lot from this experience."

Well done to all Year 7 students for their oracy skills and the winners Amos and Albert in particular for their inspirational speeches. Amos's speech was entitled "Right to Vote at the Age of 16" and Albert's was "Animal Trafficking."

Year 3 learning with Frank






Yes WeDo!






Christmas and more in this week's art


Variety is the spice of life and leads to maximum physical development!!


Introducing: RFU Green Laces
