We were delighted to receive confirmation of our Year 8 results from the senior school entrance examinations including a total of twenty two scholarships. Congratulations to all of them on their achievements. They have now started their post exam curriculum which includes the Business Enterprise course.

Eco-Council boys worked with Mr Lawrence to deliver excellent assemblies on the theme of the environment and sustainability. They focused on animal conservation and highlighted several endangered species.

I know the Pre-Prep enjoyed their visit from illustrator Nick Schon, who brought to life stories created by the boys.

Year 3 had a very interesting visit to the Mandir in Neasden and particularly enjoyed catching a glimpse of Wembley Stadium whilst Year 4 have continued on their scientific journey learning about sound.

## Outstanding Year 8 results



I am very pleased to report that our Year 8 boys have performed impressively in their senior school transfer examinations. They have all worked very hard and thoroughly deserve their success. A good number of them have gained places at more than one school. Twenty four have been offered Merchant Taylors'; six Berkhamsted; five Haberdashers'; four John Lyon; three St. Alban's; two Mill Hill; one Aldenham; one Brighton College; one Harrow and one St. Columba's. This is a fantastic reflection on the efforts they have put in. Very well done indeed to every one of them. In particular thirteen boys have achieved twenty two scholarships at 13+. This is made up of ten boys achieving thirteen academic scholarships and seven boys achieving the following scholarships: four for music, two for design and technology, two for drama and one for sport.

Zain Ahmed, our Head Boy, achieved Major Academic awards from Merchant Taylors' and Haberdashers'. He was also awarded music scholarships from both schools. Shivank Chhabra, Deputy Head Boy, was awarded a Major Academic Scholarship from both Merchant Taylors' and Haberdashers'. Matthew Hodes, Deputy Head Boy, was awarded Major Academic Scholarships from Merchant Taylors' and Haberdashers'. Matthew also gained a Music Scholarship from Haberdashers'. Krish Patel and Shivam Sangani were awarded Academic Exhibitions, both from Merchant Taylors'. Joseph Pressinger received a Major Academic Scholarship from Haberdashers' and a Music Scholarship from St Columba's. Slava Bulin, Mason Harding, Rohan Mangat and Ashok Rodrigo received Academic Scholarships from St Alban's, Berkhamsted, Mill Hill and John Lyon respectively. Shaan Fisher and Joseph Pressinger were awarded Design and Technology Scholarships from Merchant Taylors' and Rohan Mangat received a Sport Scholarship from Mill Hill. Netanel Lawrence-Ojo and Jamie Wood were awarded Drama Scholarships from Merchant Taylors' and Berkhamsted respectively. There were some other boys who were interviewed and tested at scholarship level. Congratulations on even being considered and I hope you enjoyed the experience and challenge.

What a week on the slopes!



Over half term 58 boys and staff travelled to the Austrian Alps for our biennial Ski trip. We had an early 5am start on the Saturday morning but our connections went smoothly and we were soon in our coach travelling though snow covered mountains. Our Hotel Eberlalm was nestled high on the slopes, so we had to transfer ourselves and luggage by a fleet of minibuses for the last leg of the journey. It was a scary journey on ice covered roads up very steep ascents. The snow was so thick the road was like an ice tunnel in parts, with the white walls rushing by in the dark. On arrival we met our host Daniella and had our first meal that started off a week of great food; soup followed by Spag Bol! The highlights of the week were Wiener Snitzel and pizza and there were always great desserts!

The hotel was better than we could have dreamed of, an Alpine style lodge, with clean rooms and all mod cons. The next morning when we woke to the bright sunshine, the views from our rooms were of towering jagged peaks, stunning pistes and pine forests. A breath-taking backdrop for us to have breakfast and refuel for our first day skiing. As always, getting ready on the first day took an extra special effort, but the teachers helped and everyone was eventually ready for the ski instructors. This year we had a large number of first time skiers, so they were split into three beginner groups, with the advanced and intermediate skiers forming two more groups. The skiing conditions were perfect in the cold mornings and there was a good range of slopes from blue to black, which was enough to keep even the advance skiers on their toes. The very warm sunny days did mean that the snow did get heavier in the afternoons but most of our skiing was in our longer morning sessions before lunch, so we got in plenty of good skiing. Lunch was a hot meal each day, each group returning from their skiing on different parts of the resort.

After our first days skiing we also had the first of our evening entertainments, a visit to an Aqua-park, a fun night with waterslides, diving boards and ball games. Even the Headmaster was encouraged to take a high "dive" despite his fear of heights! The other evening activities included a walk to the local town of Maria Alm which was quite an adventure in the deep snow, we also spent a night Ice Skating where the boys got to show off some of their skills on the ice, admirably led by our ski rep Sonya, who was once an Olympic ice skater. The schedule was quite tiring with all the activities so we also had some relaxing evenings in our hotel playing board games and we also had a quiz night.

On our penultimate day skiing, the advanced groups and the one of the beginner groups, skied to another mountain where they had their lunch. Most popular food of the day was bratwurst and chips! On the last day the weather changed and rather than bright sun we woke to thick fog and snow. Conditions were hard, especially on the top of the mountain where the wind added an extra difficulty. The first couple of days on the trip seemed to last forever but as the week wore on, time seemed to speed up and then, all too soon, it was time to come home again. All the boys had a great trip which was made all the more special by the team of staff who looked after the boys so splendidly and helped it run so smoothly. **Mr Lawrence**










## Year 3 visit Neasden Mandir
