

Colts & U10s v St Martin's Friday 24th May

Colts A v St Martin's Lost by 36 runs. St Martin's 72 for 5 off 20 overs, St John's 36 for 10 off 16.4 overs

Outstanding performances: Arian 2 for 5, Harmann 1 for 3, Panagiotis 1 for 9 The Colts A's started really strong and managed to restrict St Martin's to only 72 runs off their full innings, dismissing their key batters early on. As a whole really good bowling from the St John's squad. Everyone got to bowl their two overs and the improvement is clear. Good focus in the field too although we need to try and be better at constricted the singles. Unfortunately Harman and Arian were dismissed quite early on in our attack with the bat. As a squad we are really trying to improve on our shot selection and decision making and are aiming for betting consistency in this



department. The lower batting order actually did really well to get us to 36 runs considering we were only on 10 runs after 7 overs. This shows progress and especially a bit more patience with the bat from Nishil, Vish, Nikhil and Aaryan. Well done.

This was a competitive match, although played with a soft ball, which added an element of unfamiliarity to the game. St John's began in the field and there were several good performances, particularly from Rayaan who took two wickets for 13 runs, and Noah who bowled the first maiden over of the season. St Martin's set an attainable target for us of 267 runs and Louis and Sam G made a good start to our innings. The boys were batting in pairs with three overs of play per pair. Yusuf scored the highest number of runs with 14. However some rather wild and careless batting led to a plethora of wickets which lowered our total considerably. Performance at the crease remains a key area to work for this team to work on for the future.

St Martin's won the toss and chose to field first on a really good wicket at Harefield Cricket Club. St John's had a poor start to their innings losing a couple of quick wickets, but managed to gather themselves and built up a good total of 104 runs through some solid batting. However, St John's really showed their quality when it came to their turn to bowl. Wickets fell regularly through a combination of batsmen being clean bowled and some outstanding catches, notably from Nayan, who caught out two batsmen, Ansh with a one-handed effort and Oliver. Zac put in a super display behind the stumps and the side as a whole were sharp and lively in the field. This restricted St Martin's to 86 runs all out in the nineteenth over giving St John's a really well-fought victory. Very well done to all of the team with Sahib S earning the man-of-the-match accolade for his excellent display with both the bat and the ball.

With St John's winning the toss and batting first on this 25 over match we played steadily but each partnership managed to get out just as they started to get into the game. Overall 6 lbws and 2 run outs. The lbws came from batsmen over covering their stumps and as a result losing wickets rapidly. We managed to get to 86 for 5 off 15 overs with Shivam, Shane and Alex all playing some good shots with 2 6's from Alex and Aadil. The key partnership then was Aadil and Shane who were unfortunately run out as a result of Shane calling to run on a miss field which was marginal and the decision given against us. Aadil and Skye hit some good blows and ran exceptionally between the wickets. The tail went cheaply setting 113 as a target. 


House Art Competition Winners
